The BUILD Workshop in Review

This month we round up The BUILD - Black Women Mentorship & Skills Advancement Program which was designed to create avenues for Black women to build intergenerational networks through mentorship from accomplished women of African descent in BC, as well as develop indemand skills through workshops. The BUILD started in July and participants took part in a range of workshops from Ecommerce to Ux Research. August workshop topics included Grant and Proposal Writing by Nerrisa Allen, UX research by Abena Edugyan, Entrepreneurship by Agnes Nkundabagenzi, Ecommerce by Aboubakar Idriss and Marketing & Communication by Kara Randall holding in September. Each participant had the opportunity to be mentored by two accomplished women of African Descent who are leaders in their various fields. AACCCS History & Founder



Pulchérie Mboussi was born in Cameroon, in the beautiful continent of Africa and immigrated to Canada in the mid-1980s. Pulcherie quickly earned a reputation as a strong community leader and an advocate of promoting and celebrating the rich and diverse cultures of Africa and the Caribbean. After moving from Montreal Canada to Victoria, BC in 2010, she developed her life-long commitment as an

Ambassador of African and Caribbean culture into the African Art & Cultural Community Contributor CCC. Inc. (AACCCS), founded October 19, 2012. AACCCS is a social enterprise that manages projects that increase the scope and impact of action that promotes the development of Black Communities in BC. In 2021, AACCCS was mandated to act as the Community Convener for people of African Descent living in British Columbia through the BC Resilience Project.

Since its inception, AACCCS has hosted a broad range of cultural, educational, and artistic activities, events, and programs which promote community development and cultural heritage.
